or centuries, the members of the Hennessy Comité de Dégustation have met to taste eaux-de-vie and blend the boldest cognacs. For Hennessy X.O the most iconic Hennessy cognac, created in 1870 - seven distinct chapters were identified from a single sip, each seamlessly flowing into the next: Sweet Notes, Rising Heat, Flowing Flame, Chocolate Lull, Spicy Edge, Wood Crunches and Infinite Echo. Invited to the Maison Hennessy in France, seven artists from seven countries along the Silk Road immersed themselves in Hennessy's traditional savoir-faire and craftsmanship. An exciting exchange of ideas between the artists and Hennessy was then born, their unique artwork mirroring the personal and sensorial journey behind each drop of Hennessy X.O and reflecting their own experiences of this evocative and timeless journey.

The odyssey begins in **Istanbul**'s Karaköy quarter, where artist **Burçak Bingöl** has her atelier. Tables overflow with white pottery and flowers from her visit to the Hennessy Château de Bagnolet.

"This tied in perfectly with my interest in the Silk Road," she says, "as one of the art forms from Asia was the floral motif the Chinese used on their blue-and-white pottery." To see more, she heads across town to the 15th-century Topkapi Palace. "Look at the detail," she smiles, pointing to a panel decorated with blue and white flowers. "We call these Ancient Chinese lotus blossoms hatayi, and that's what I'll name my project for Hennessy, fusing ideas from the East and West — just like Istanbul."






